

Palmarium Lodge



The Palmarium Lodge is situated in the Pangalanes, which consists of a series of lakes linked by artificial canals. These were built in the French colonial times for commercial use. The canals are today used mostly by local fishermen for fishing and transporting of goods between small villages and the main port of Toamasina. In recent years, this area has become popular with tourists and a number of bungalows and private nature reserves

have been developed along the banks of the lakes. The Palmarium reserve, also named Ankanin'ny Nofy (dream nest) is situated on the East coast of Madagascar, a 50 ha place, embedded along the Ampitabe lake and the Indian ocean, in the Pangalanes Channel. The Palmarium Lodge boasts a beautiful site, charming service and good food.

If you fancy extending your adventure, several large, comfortable bungalows with ensuite facilities are at your disposal. Equipped with a bath room and a lake-view terrace, you will be allowed to live a magic experience, near to nature, rocked by the waves' and woods' noise.



The fresh water lakes of the Pangalanes offer visitors clear water for swimming and white sandy beaches for relaxation. The small neighboring reserve has an impressive collection of palms and a selection of lemurs. A local guide will take you through the forest and guide you to the lemurs. These friendly forest dwellers are free-ranging and tame. This makes photographing these normally rare species easy and rewarding.
