

Djuma Game Reserve

Djuma Game Reserve - part of the Sabi Sand South Africa - offers guests the choice of two luxury safari lodges: from the magnificent Bush Lodge to the unique Vuyatela. Find the sense of the magic of Africa and an atmosphere of warm hospitality as you see the splendid sights and sounds of the African Savanna. Enjoy an early cup of coffee or tea before setting off to explore the African bush on an exciting game drive. You could spot the Big Five. There are also a diverse range of different bird species you could see including African Fish Eagle, Pygmy Kingfisher and Redbilled Helmetshrike.

Vuyatela

Djuma Vuyatela is a unique safari lodge in Sabi Sand with unique African art throughout its interiors. Beautiful mosaics adorn the walls while vibrant and colorful crockery decorate the tables. Djuma Vuyatela Lodge combines the natural and the contemporary cultural components of Africa for the South African safari experience.



The chalets, with private deck, pool and detached sitting room, reflect local architecture. Builders used corrugated iron and mud to achieve an authentic effect without sacrificing luxury in any way. Each of the eight chalets or 'kayas' is secluded in African bush; with bedroom, dressing-room and bathroom (including bath and outdoor shower), separate lounge, private deck and plunge pool, as well as air-conditioning, fans, mosquito nets, a telephone and bar fridge.

Bush Lodge

Djuma Bush Lodge is a small, intimate camp that is never crowded and its



surrounding wildlife, excellent food, great service and friendly atmosphere have visitors returning time and again. The Lodge's rugged setting, sturdy wooden construction and African décor guarantee a back to nature experience.

Djuma Bush comprises eight thatched chalets with en-suite rooms, showers, toilets, sinks, air-conditioning, overhead fans and mosquito nets, two viewing decks, a library and a swimming pool. The chalets are tucked away in indigenous gardens and cater for a maximum of sixteen guests.

Game viewing in this area is exceptional. There is no boundary between the private areas and the Kruger National Park, and game, including the Big 5 (lion, leopard, buffalo, elephant and rhino) is free to move in and out of the area. Game viewing with knowledgeable rangers takes place in both vehicles and on foot, and time is taken to enjoy the sights and sounds with the vehicle stopped and the engine off.
