

Ngorongoro Wildlife Lodge

Ngorongoro Crater is a large caldera 600 meters deep that hosts the most unique eco – system on Earth, with 20,000 large grazing mammals and the largest concentration



of predators on Earth playing a key role in the maintenance of the ecological balance. Ngorongoro Wildlife Lodge is dramatically perched on the rim of this Africa’s Eden, Ngorongoro Crater, offering unbelievable views plunging down over the crater floor, 7,500 feet above the sea level. The Lodge is elegantly built mainly from natural stone and local wood and timber, harmoniously merging with its natural surroundings, and it is provided with panoramic windows that

encompass superb views of the crater’s great bowl. From its privileged position, all the Lodge’s 75 rooms afford breathtaking uninterrupted views, and the open-air terrace of the Rhino Lounge Bar offers superb panoramic views of the whole crater.

Ngorongoro Wildlife Lodge’s 75 spacious guestrooms, all affording fabulous views over the crater. Exquisitely decorated, offering a serene atmosphere of elegance, the rooms are fully equipped with ensuite bathrooms, shower attachments, bathtub and central heating system. All the beds are provided with mosquito nets over the air vents. A third bed is available on request, as well as limited baby cots.



A day trip to Olduvai Gorge can be organized for the delight of those interested to visit one of the first evidences of activities of the ancestors of humankind; also, it’s worth a visit to the nearby Laetoli, where hominid footprints are preserved in



volcanic rock 3.6 million years old. Nature lovers can enjoy several amazing activities such as, spectacular wildlife watching, walking photographic safaris, game drives, black rhino and the largest concentration of predators found on the planet, specialized ornithological safaris, and walks along the edge of the crater towards Lake Eyasi. Also, visits can be organized to authentic Masai villages, to enjoy a close encounter with almost mythic cattle keepers and warriors dressed in intense red

clothes. And, in the evenings, displays of traditional Masai dance, song, performance and music are organized in the Lodge, as well as wildlife talks, videos and film shows.
